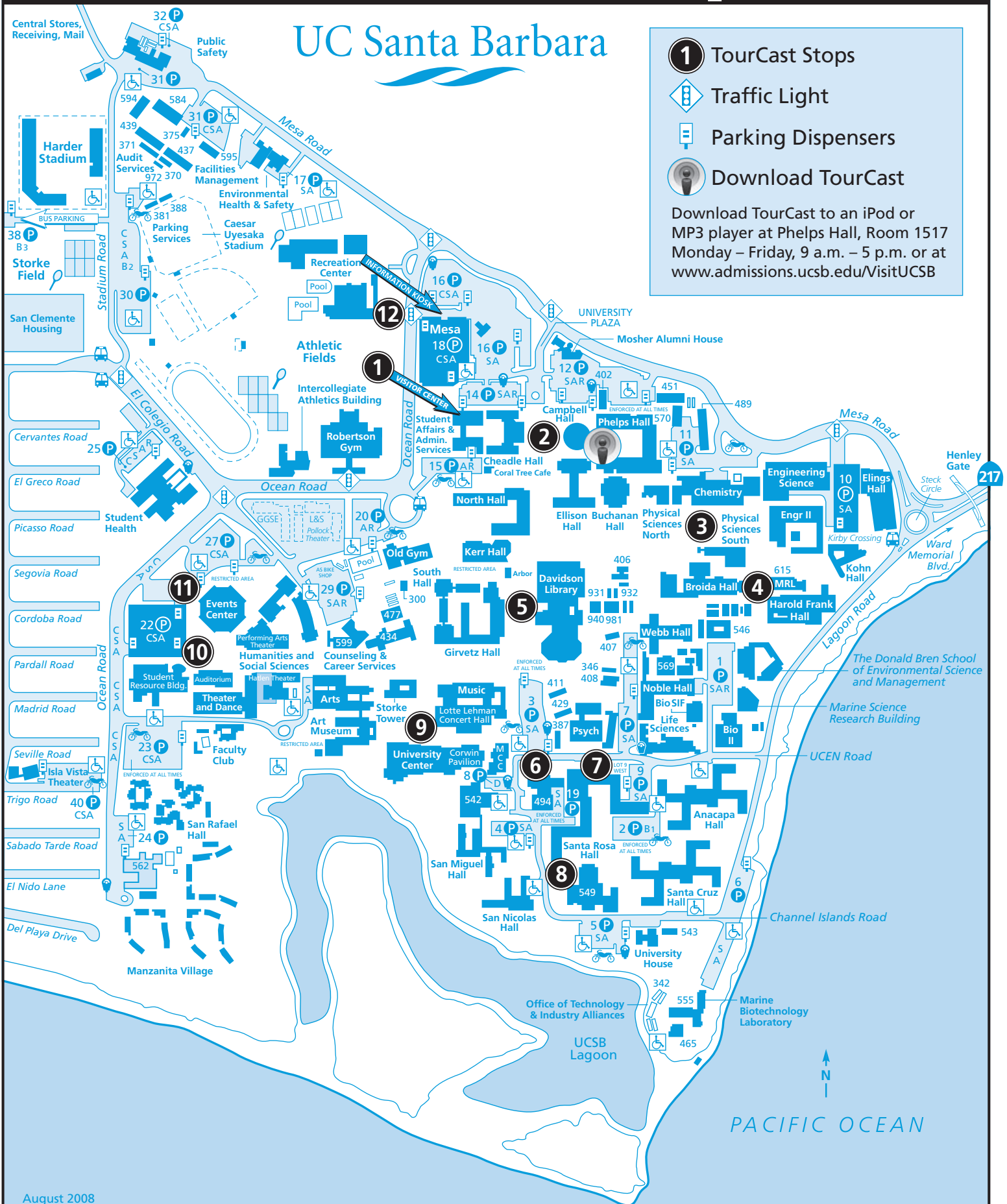

1 Visitor Center & TourCast Introduction and Instructions

The Visitor Center is a great resource for pre-admission information. Visit the Visitor Center during office hours, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. (Also, see other side for information on downloading an audio “TourCast” to an iPod or MP3 player.)

2 Campbell Hall & Cheadle Hall

Campbell Hall, the largest auditorium on campus with 860 seats, serves as a lecture hall and a performance venue for Arts & Lectures performances. The average class size in our largest college, the College of Letters & Science (L&S), is 47 students.

Cheadle Hall houses the academic advising office for L&S along with other administrative offices. Students can get help scheduling their courses and deciding on a major. The College of Letters and Science has approximately 16,000 undergraduates and 2,000 graduate students in nearly 90 majors and interdisciplinary programs as well as 40 minors.

3 Campus Green & Science Buildings

The east end of campus is home to our science buildings. Here you will find a variety of shade trees, art sculptures, and the eternal flame, along with Chemistry, Engineering, Physics, Earth Sciences, Biological Sciences, Marine Science, and Psychology.

4 Harold Frank Hall (Engineering I)

Here College of Engineering students will find their academic advising office and state-of-the-art classrooms. The College of Engineering has approximately 1,500 undergraduates in five majors, and 700 graduate students.

5 Davidson Library

The library contains more than 2.8 million books and journals and provides computerized access to all holdings of the University of California library system. Take the elevator to the eighth floor to find a scale model of the campus and enjoy a breathtaking view of the surrounding campus area. As you leave the library you will enter the Arbor area of campus where you will find students eating, relaxing, socializing, and studying.

6 College of Creative Studies (CCS)

College of Creative Studies, the “graduate school for undergraduates,” has approximately 325 students who find their college office and advising center here. CCS offers eight majors ranging from Physics to Art for focused undergraduate students to explore and actively create new knowledge in their chosen field.

7 Santa Rosa Residence Hall

Santa Rosa is one of eight residence halls on campus. Please ask at the front desk to view the model room. UCSB Housing and Residential Services provides the following amenities and special programs: study lounges, quiet hours, computer rooms, in-room Internet connections, and special interest floors that bring students with similar academic, cultural, and social interests together.

8 De La Guerra Dining Commons

Housing and Residential Services operates four dining commons: Carrillo, Ortega, De La Guerra, and Santa Catalina. Included with your housing contract is a 10, 14, or 19-per-week meal plan. Each all-you-can-eat dining commons has staggered operating hours and accommodates varying dietary needs.

9 University Center (UCen) & Storke Tower

Located at the edge of a beautiful lagoon, the University Center (UCen) provides services for students, faculty, and staff. The UCen includes the campus bookstore, post office, travel agency, automated teller machines, and food court. Adjacent to the UCen is the Multicultural Center (MCC) where the campus community can attend films, discussions, and events celebrating diversity and culture.

Storke Tower is the largest steel structure in the tri-county area. The tower is 175-feet tall, holds 61 bells, and rings 10 minutes before the hour and on the hour.

10 Student Resource Building

The newest building on our tour, the Student Resource Building, offers resources from counseling and tutoring to cultural centers and technology labs. The Educational Opportunity Program, Office of International Students and Scholars, Women’s Center, Office of Student Life, Disabled Students Program, Office of Judicial Affairs, Resource Center for Sexual and Gender Diversity, Children’s Center, Campus Learning Assistance Services, and a Graduate Division Satellite are located here.

11 Events Center, Student Health & Isla Vista

The Events Center, also known as the Thunderdome, is home to our NCAA Division I basketball and volleyball teams and seats 6,000 people.

Student Health specializes in high quality, accessible primary health care and health education for the UCSB campus community.

Looking west you will see the edge of Isla Vista, the college town located directly adjacent to campus. Isla Vista is roughly one square mile and is occupied by nearly 19,000 residents, 12,000 of whom are UCSB students.

12 Aquatic and Recreation Center (Rec Cen)

This state-of-the-art fitness center is a testament to UCSB’s emphasis on healthy living and includes weight rooms, pools, aerobic machines, and numerous sports courts. The 2005 addition includes a 3-story rock climbing wall, a jacuzzi, and a roller hockey rink. Children are not permitted in the Recreation Center.
